ENROLLMENT STATISTICS

FALL 1985

Fall Semester 1985 regular on-campus enrollment at Colorado State University is 18,084 students, a decrease of 10 students, or 0.1 percent, below Fall Semester 1984 when enrollment was 18,094 regular on-campus students.

This fall men represent 52.4 percent of the on-campus enrollment, and women represent 47.6 percent. Last fall men represented 52.2 percent and women 47.8 percent of the enrollment. Compared to Fall 1984, the number of men increased by 37 students, or 0.4 percent, and the number of women decreased by 47 students, or 0.5 percent.

On-campus students represent all 50 states, as well as the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, the Virgin Islands, and 82 foreign countries. Enrollment includes 62 of Colorado's 63 counties.

Colorado residents make up 82.0 percent of the on-campus enrollment and nonresidents 18.0 percent. The percentage of Colorado residents increased 0.6 percentage points over the 81.4 percent of Fall 1984.

This fall 88.5 percent of the students are attending full-time, and 11.5 percent are attending part-time. This is a 0.1 percentage point decrease from Fall 1984 in the percent of full-time students. Of the resident students, 88.4 percent are attending full-time, and of the nonresidents, 88.8 percent are attending full-time. [The definition of a full-time student is an undergraduate taking 12 or more credits, a graduate student taking 9 or more credits, or a professional-level student taking 15 or more credits.]
