FALL SEMESTER 1986

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Fall Semester 1986 regular on-campus enrollment at Colorado State University is 18,381, an increase of 297 students, or 1.6 percent, above Fall Semester 1985 when enrollment was 18,084 regular on-campus students. Colorado residents make up 81.2 percent of the on-campus enrollment and nonresidents 18.8 percent. This is the first semester nonresident enrollment has increased since Fall 1977.

Enrollment by registration type for Fall 1985 and Fall 1986 is shown in Table II. Transfer students showed the largest increase with 223 students followed by new freshmen with an increase of 127 students. New graduate and readmitted students increased 12.2 percent (96 students). Table III, Enrollment by Classification, shows the largest increase in percent of enrollment occurred in the sophomore class. Graduate students (excluding Professional Veterinary Medicine) also exhibited small increases. The percentages of freshmen, juniors, seniors and graduate level II Professional Veterinary Medicine students have declined from last fall's levels. The change in enrollment from Fall 1985 to Fall 1986 by college is shown in Table IV. Four colleges showed increases in enrollment over Fall 1985. For the second year, the College of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences had the largest increase in number of students (187). The College of Business increased its enrollment by 7 percent with the addition of 143 students. College enrollment information is available by residency, class and registration type in the table starting on page 8 and by ethnicity and class in the table starting on page 10.

This fall 87.3 percent of the students are attending full time and 12.7 percent are attending part time. An increase of 160 full-time nonresidents offset the decrease of 115 full-time residents for a net increase of 45 full-time students. (A full-time student is defined as an undergraduate taking 12 or more credits, a graduate student taking 9 or more credits or a professional-level student taking 15 or more credits.) Part-time/full-time information is also available by college and sex in the table on page 5.
